## Biographical Note

David Glenn Harvey was born to Samuel and Ellen Harvey in Sardinia, New York, on October 13, 1889. He registered for the draft in June 1917, though no evidence exists that he was conscripted, owing to his status as a breadwinning, married father.

David Glenn Harvey died in August 1966.

## Scope and Content of the Collection

The Glenn Harvey Collection contains one folder of postcards to Glenn Harvey, one folder of wartime documents related to the Harvey family, and one folder containing newspaper clippings detailing soldiers from Harvey's home county. The collection relates to Harvey's activities before and during American involvement in World War I.
